The air is filled with voices and pictures transmitted from radio and video sources, our lives are filled with sounds and pictures that demand our attention it's amazing how much time is spent listening to messages

and watching video on phones and other devices each day. It's such a challenge were all wired to respond and explore all the communications with one and another. Are we as responsive to the promptings of the Holy Spirit?

God speaks physically to us in a personal way through the many voices around us some are from most unusual sources. I have heard and seen God's profound revelation in the most obscure ways in amongst all these distractions like watching a film or listening to the News. The Holy Ghost is quite comfortable to be in our company even when we're relaxing; He's a friend who sticks closer than a brother, how wonderful.

God's revelation is difficult to hold in the mind because it comes through a quickening of the Holy Ghost, in our new Spirit man within us. We need to write it down and then it has the potential power in the words we write to be quickened again to us by God when we share and minster.

His words are often fleeting and pass in a moment only, we forget them as were human, but they lay in our subconscious Spirit. Like a radio or television, the either is filled with communications but The Holy Spirit tunes us in to His voice. We know His voice and His manifest visual revelation as we see Him portray what He wants to show us at that instant. Here's an update from James and Theresa.

The Bible says "Some trust in chariots, some trust in horses, but we trust in the name of the Lord our God."

We thank God for his grace, mercy and love. Once again, He has seen us through. 2020 has had its challenges, discomforts and turbulence. These times are not normal for all of us, feeling the anxiety of battling the invisible enemy that's rattling our world physically, emotionally, economically and culturally. We've not had any visitors because people are not able to travel to Ghana, the children are used in receiving visitors from Europe, for sightseeing, games school activities etc., the children miss these visits.

Another challenge was the closure of the school, life became more difficult for the children, plus the electricity supply was unreliable and the water was stopped. The water is still stopped and we have to buy water for all the children every other two weeks, to fill the water tank and barrel at the home.

We have taught the children about social distancing, wearing face masks, do not shake hands, washing and sanitizing of the hands. We have also bought face masks and sanitizers for them, as often as they needed it.

Big George, the oldest of the boys has completed his education and at present he is helping at the orphanage, finding a job at the moment is difficult. He is also training to become a footballer.

Patience the eldest of the girls in the home, has completed her studies in home economics, which includes management and catering services, she wants to do some more vocational training but at the present time is managing the school kitchen with another cook.

Prinscilla is attending Apam Senior high school at the Central Region of Ghana, 3 hours from Accra in a boarding school, she is studying business which includes Accounting and Maths.

Gifty is also in a senior high school at the Volta Region of Ghana, about 4 hours from Accra she is studying general Arts which includes bilingual studies. Albert is in the same school as Gifty studying History and Geography.

The other George attends day school learning metalwork at the technical school.

Peter, Nicholas, Raphael, Kennedy and our daughter Karen have all finished their examinations and are hoping to attend High School if funds allow. The government says they will be open in March. Eight children attending senior high school is expensive, whilst the fees are paid for by the government there are other costs to be paid of about £400 for each child before they can attend for things they need e.g. mattresses, trunks, plus equipment for studies.

Pascaline, Arthur, Kate, Angela, Ativi and Isabella remain at the Church school, although it is only open to limited number of children, we are trusting God the schools will reopen, for them to start a normal life.



"When you find the real Christ, you will find true perspective, and the real you". I read this statement in a daily devotional. This got me thinking about perspective, what does this mean? Why is this important? And why do I need to find Christ to find it and to find me.

The dictionary defines perspective in a few different ways, the one I feel is the most fitting is "the state of one's ideas, the facts known to one". Our perspective is dependent on what we have been told or exposed to. We depict a situation in a certain way, because of what we know and have experienced in life. This means that one's perspective of a situation is not the same as another. If my perspective is based on what I know and what I have experienced, it means that my perspective can change depending on my circumstances. However, the statement made above talks about true perspective. If there is true perspective, then that means there can also be a false perspective. True perspective we find in Christ.

Our struggles as humans are very real, the pain and hurt we experience are all real. It is so easy to focus on the struggle, or the pain, or the hurt. When we focus on these things that is all we see, we limit our vision. When you focus on the struggle, you cannot fix the struggle. When you focus on the pain, you will not be able to fix the pain, and when you focus on the hurt, the hurt remains. The important thing to remember is that it is not about what we can do in these circumstances. The important thing is who we have, the One we should constantly be searching for.

When you find the real Christ, you find true perspective. Who is the real Christ? "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me" (John 14:6). "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever" (Hebrews 13:8). If our perspective is dependent on him, that means our perspective should be the same yesterday, today and forever. Our perspective

should therefore not be dependent on what we know and what we have experienced, but Who we know. By basing our perspective on what we know and what we have experienced, we are limiting ourselves. We do not know everything, and we have not experienced everything. We only know what is true for us, but that is not the truth. The truth is the word that God has spoken over our lives, the paths that He has laid out for us and the places He is taking us to.

An aspect of this is also finding ourselves. As a young woman, I feel like I am finding myself every day and I believe that does not stop as we get older, or maybe it does, someone can correct me if I am wrong. However, it should not stop as we are constantly growing as people. We were all placed on this earth for a reason. We are all blessed with the opportunity of having a relationship with Christ, this too is for a reason. Once we tap into that relationship, and focus on knowing him more, it changes who we want to be. Our perspective on life changes and we start to want to see the glass half full. I say want, because it is not always that easy, sometimes we can lose perspective and we need to be reminded of who Christ is and what He has done and is doing in our lives. The reason we find ourselves in Christ is because knowing Him, completes us. We realise that He is all we need in life.

Jesus in Luke 6:20-23 states the following:

In December 2012 I found myself at Basildon hospital

fighting an Acute Pulmonary Embolism that caught me by

surprise and took 90% of my ability to breathe. As I laid

in the hospital bed fighting for every breath, I took refuge

worse night where I felt I was not going to make it to the

next morning, I got off my bed and with the little strength

I had, I got on my knees and asked God: 'not yet please'.

I was begging God to keep me here for a bit longer.

I felt as if that moment became a rededication of my

life to Him. It was the beginning of something new.

So, a few months later, whilst I was going through my

recovery, I had a supernatural visitation of the Holy

Spirit. It was night-time again when I had a dream that

our balcony door opened, and a strong wind came

into our flat. This wind blew on me so strong that not

only I heard it, but I felt it in my face to the point it

hastily woke me up. As I opened my eyes and I looked

around, I found myself in the very same place where

the dream had taken place. The Holy Spirit had come

to bring the oxygen I had been lacking and to breathe

the breath of life in me! Through the years, I continue to

experience the effect that moment had in my life. Not

only I am fully recovered but I am now full of life in Jesus.

forever and we get to live His life instead. A holy and righteous life that is forever attached to the Father.

However, this also means that we are to become like Him. This means we are now called to live in a continuous relationship with the Father. We are called to share His message of salvation and we are even called to carry His cross. Jesus said to the disciples in Luke 9:23 "If anyone would come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me". This means that we no longer live for our own desires or for our own needs, but we now live for Him.

Jesus endured a very painful and torturous death on that cross for one purpose; to show God's love for all of us and so that we could live an eternal life with Him.

This message is too glorious to keep it hidden or to keep it just to myself. As a result, the Holy Spirit has given me an uncontrollable desire to share with as many people as I can about God's love for them through Jesus. This has been happening in the supermarket, at my workplace or in places where I had not even planned to be. I have therefore decided I am not going to try to control this glory that is bouncing all inside of me but rather, I am going to take up my cross and I will do exactly what Jesus did. I will share with the unloved the love of God.

After all, it is in my DNA. Sharing the gospel is nothing else than sharing God's love with others. No judgment, no accusation, just love. When Jesus came close to people, He was motivated by love. The leper, the adulterer, the sinner, me... it was just love. 'Love consists in this: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins' (1 John 4:10).

As a I left Tesco yesterday after doing my shopping, I saw this homeless man sitting by the entrance. I had seen him before, but I had not had the courage to talk to him. But yesterday, drawn by love, I finally went and talked to him. A few minutes later, this man had received true love in His heart. He had received Jesus as His Lord and Saviour! I do not know which one of us was happier but all I did was to love him. A man who many people may despise or see as a nuisance, as the beggar, as someone who put himself there. But when the love of God is in you, it is just a natural thing: 'let us love one another, because love is from God, and everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God' (I John 4; 7). The gospel is simple, my beloved. It is in our DNA.

This experience of mine is nothing else but a representation of the second chance that God has given us through his Son: Jesus! We all have been in that hospital bed. We all have been in that time where we faced death and life, however it only took one cry, one prayer, one repented and helpless heart for Jesus to trade our dead spirits for

His everlasting life. This is the greatest thing a human being will ever experience. It changes us HEARING THE VOICE OF GOD

It was our prayer last week in our local church meeting that we might hear more of the Word of God in this coming year, to have ears to hear and a heart receptive to Him. Just like it says in the letters to the churches in Revelations "To him that hath an ear to hear, let him hear what the Spirit is saying to the churches". Then I came across this verse in Isaiah 50:4 where Isaiah is declaring that-

"He awakens me morning by morning, He awakens my ear to hear as the learned"

What an encouragement to know that God is in the business of opening ears and causing us to hear Him, even on a daily basis. This is the will of God for each of us, Jesus even taught us to pray to the Father for 'our daily bread' because He knew we'd need it. It reminds me of the old TV advert for 'Ready Brek' which pictured kids walking about glowing and describing this breakfast cereal as 'central heating for kids'. We need to eat of the Word, our Holy Spirit inspired Ready Brek, to centrally heat us and cause us to glow in the darkness.

I've come to realise that this isn't just a 'nice to have' it's crucial for us to live victoriously and to operate in His divine will. We need to know what He's saying to the church as a whole but also to us personally, to live righteously, to be cleansed, strengthened, corrected, directed and so much more.

2020 was a very unusual year, I'm not sure any of us could have predicted the impact the pandemic has had on the whole world at all levels of society, but as it says in Isaiah 44:8-

"Do not tremble, do not be afraid. Did I not proclaim this and foretell it long ago? You are my witnesses. Is there any God besides me? No, there is no other Rock; I know not one."

Here I believe the Lord is telling us not to be alarmed or afraid, He is God, there is none beside Him, nothing has taken Him by surprise and nothing need take us by surprise either as the signs of the times appear. We are living in the last days when things we may have all relied on have been shaken or removed, but we are anchored to this Rock and we know no other source of help. That anchor will hold sure and will carry us through to glory.

We're called to be witnesses of this fact and the world, now more than ever, needs to hear the living Word of God. As the enemy seeks to reap his end-time harvest so we must be that beacon in the darkness and have a saving 'Word in season' on our lips. Isaiah tells us the Word also sustains the weary, and in proverbs 15:23 it tells us how good an aptly spoken word is to the hearer, and it also brings joy to the one sharing it too. (I love that heavenly economy don't you?)

We can't talk about the word of God without referencing the verses we're all so familiar with, ones I've come to see in a new light recently which are from Rom 10:17 and



Hebrews II:1 "Faith comes by hearing and hearing by the Word of God".

"Now Faith is the substance of things hoped for and the evidence of things not seen".

When we hear the word of God it creates substance and evidence of things. God's word has always created, even from the very beginning when God spoke the world into existence from void and darkness. His word wasn't just uttered and nothing happened, it went forth and created exactly what was spoken and we have evidence of it today. His Word will not return void! It is the only word we can truly trust and stake our lives upon.

We should be mindful, however, that when we hear the word of God, the enemy will try and steal away the truth with other 'voices' particularly when there's a lot at stake -a destiny or defining moment perhaps. Like when God told Eve not to take of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil and the enemy came along to question God's word and her faith in it "did God really say?" or when Peter got out of the boat and walked on the water at Jesus command to 'Come', but then he listened to the sound of his circumstances and began to sink. Believing God's word gives us confidence not just to survive but to be more than conquerors in every circumstance we face. All God's promises are 'Yes' and 'Amen' to those who believe, so there's a lot in store for us.

So in this New Year let's ask God to give us ears attuned to the Spirit's voice and when we hear Him that we might believe his word with unwavering faith. We can't win our battles with willpower or self-discipline, we have to have the substance and sustenance that comes with and from the Word of God. Let's also stay alert and ready to shut down all other voices that we might determinedly walk in those 'good works' which God has ordained for each

of us to walk in (Eph 2:10). Amen
